

MAINE INITIATIVES HAS JOINED THE GIVING PROJECT NETWORK,

a collaboration of nine progressive funders across the country dedicated to moving money and power to their local grassroots organizing infrastructure. This exciting first year pilot will engage 20-25 dedicated community members to participate in a transformative learning cohort and serve as grantmaking committee for grants resourcing community organizing efforts in Maine.

All Giving Projects across the country utilize the same proven model:

RELATIONSHIP BUILDING

 Inviting a group of people from diverse racial and economic backgrounds to form a cohort that comes together approximately 8-10 times, over a 6 month period.

POLITICAL EDUCATION

 Through workshops, training, and peer support, the cohort deeply explores the impacts of racial capitalism and develops a shared understanding of how race, class, and power intersect in our society.

RESOURCING MOVEMENTS

- Each person makes a meaningful financial gift, whatever that may mean to them, before mobilizing resources within their communities.
- The cohort selects the slate of recipients, granting significant financial resources to inspiring and effective grassroots organizations in our community.

SKILL BUILDING & COMMUNITY CONNECTION

 Each person commits to organizing their community to give - family, friends, neighbors, and more – to support the financial goal of the cohort. This process is heavily supported by staff and designed to be accessible to those with all levels of fundraising experience.

DEMOCRATIC DECISION-MAKING

 The cohort is trained in the process of democratic grantmaking, including reading and scoring proposals, interviewing applicants, and equitable group decision making.
